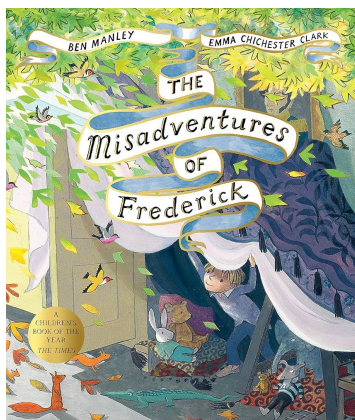




ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY

Language Choices
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You- to put the reader on the spot and make them think Alliteration- used to emphasis an idea and make it memorable. Facts-. This is used to add plausibility and validates the argument Anecdotes- to support and provide evidence for the point you are trying to make Power of Three- adds emphasis and makes something memorable Rhetorical question- provokes the audience to think Exaggeration/hyperbole-used for dramatic effect, creates vivid images and heightens emotions Adverbs & modal verbs- used to indicate degree of possibility and urge the reader to act

Structure of a letter
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sender's address in top-right corner Date under the sender's address Recipient's address on lefthand side Start with 'Dear...' or 'To whom it may concern...' Sign off with 'Yours sincerely...'or 'Yours faithfully...'

Adverbs
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> probably definitely likely Certainly Maybe undoubtedly surely
