

## <u>Curriculum Information – Year 4</u>

Dear Parents/Carers,

It is so lovely to see all the children back in the classroom, after a well-deserved break.

We are going to practising our Times Tables, ready for the summer test!

We will be covering a range of subject areas this half term as outlined below.

English	This half term in English, the children will begin with a unit on persuasive letters, where they will ultimately write a persuasive letter to an audience of their choice. They will explore and use a range of persuasive techniques. We will look at the texts Malala's Magic Pencil by Malala Yousafzai and Greta and The Giants by Zoe Tucker and Zoe Persico.
	We will use a range of texts to continue to practise our reading and comprehension skills including extracts from Alice in Wonderland.
	Spelling sessions:
	Explore suffixes beginning with vowel letters to words of more than one syllable
	2. Review the soft g sound /dʒ/ spelt g, ge or dge
	3. Explore words ending with the /g/ sound spelt –gue
	<ul><li>4. Explore words ending with the /k/ sound spelt –que</li><li>5. Explore words with the /ʃ/ sound spelt ch-</li></ul>
Maths	Our maths learning this half term will focus on:
	• Decimals
	• Fractions
	<ul> <li>Negative Numbers – Counting through Zero and Calculating in Context</li> <li>multiplication</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Times table practise will take place several times a week to ensure children are confident at recalling their 2,5,10, 3, 4 and 8 times table before progressing to learning and securing both multiplication and division facts for the 6,7,9,11 and 12s times</li> </ul>

Science	In Science this half term, we are looking at the topic of <b>Living things and their habitats</b> .
	They will learn about the different ways of classifying animals and plants e.g. fish, mammals, amphibians, etc. The children will also look at habitats and threats they face.

RSE	Life Cycles (Notes from Scheme) In this session, pupils will explore the miraculous nature of human conception and birth. With the underpinning knowledge that we were handmade by God with our parents' help, children will go on a journey to discover how life is created in the womb. It is worth noting that sexual intercourse is not discussed in this session. The session ends with a thanksgiving meditation.
	Beginnings and Endings (Notes from Scheme) Framed within the Christian understanding of eternal life, pupils will learn to consider and communicate about death in a direct yet gentle way, understand some of the feelings experienced when a person dies (grief) and consider ways to support themselves and others.
