We have had a busy start to our Autumn 2 term. In one LOTC session, we created our own self-portraits using natural materials. We took all of our foraged findings back to the classroom to compile our pieces of work. The children loved creating these. In another session we were celebrating friendship week by making kindness trees. We started with an empty tree template that was in desperate need of leaves to bring it back to life. The children foraged leaves from around the playground and wrote on them ways in which we can show kindness to other people such as sharing our resources and checking on people if they seem sad. We then filled our trees with kindness leaves. We are looking forward to the Advent season and the wonderful celebrations to come over the next few weeks.












Year 4

RYear 4 have been enjoying learning how an electrical circuit works in our science lessons this term. We have been learning about the Roman invasion of Britain in our history lessons and enjoyed going on a school trip to the Verulamium museum in St Albans. Our RE topic this term has been based on prophets and the children have learned about Elijah and John the Baptist. In maths Year 4 have been using multiplication and division facts to solve real life problems.





Year 5

In year 5, we have been really busy enjoying our learning. Here are some of the highlights from the last few weeks. In English, we enjoyed researching and writing a biography about an inspirational person. In maths, we have been moving from the concrete, to the pictorial, then to formal methods for addition and subtraction. We are now moving onto multiplication. In Geography, we have been learning about the Alps and have made wonderful informative posters. We have learnt about databases in computing and have created our own and added data to them. We also enjoyed taking part in an archery competition and having crazy hair on Crazy Hair Day.







Year 6

During our Year 6 archery competition, Mrs Moxham came in and we took part in several archery challenges. We collected our best scores and added them together.

In RE, Year 6 explored the story of Miriam from Exodus by acting out two scenes: one showing Miriam's real role in protecting baby Moses, and another imagining what might have happened without her. Through this, we discovered how important Miriam was in God's plan, and how her courage helped shape the future of her people.

Reminder: 2027/ 2028 Admissions policy – Consultation period

Holy Family School is consulting on the proposed admissions arrangements for the **school year 2027/28** and is seeking responses from parent/carers, schools and community groups.

The proposed change is to include the following new category in our Admissions Policy 2027/2028. This category would applied to the admissions oversubscription criteria.

1. The employment of a parent or legal guardian as a member of staff at the school at the time of application will increase the priority of an application within each category so that the application will be placed at the top of the category in which the application is made after children in (i) and (ii) above.
